



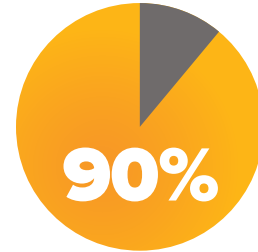

AREA OF EXPERTISE

Prevention of Mother-to-Child Transmission of HIV

SERVICES PROVIDED

- Provide pregnant women with HIV testing and counseling to ensure timely access to HIV prevention, care and treatment services
- provide antiretroviral drugs (ARVs) to HIV-positive women and their infants to prevent transmission during pregnancy, delivery and breastfeeding
- Initiate HIV-positive pregnant women on treatment per national guidelines
- Educate and support breastfeeding mothers to ensure safe and appropriate infant feeding practices
- Provide pregnant women with education about HIV primary prevention

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Provided over 23 million women with access to services to prevent vertical transmission of HIV to their babies
- Provided over 1.5 million pregnant women with ARV prophylaxis to prevent mother-to-child HIV transmission
- Tested over 21 million pregnant women for HIV through our programs

Maternal Newborn and Child Health

SERVICES PROVIDED

- Keep infants and children health by providing infant and young child feeding support, and care and follow-up of HIV-exposed infants
- Train health care providers working in PMTCT in: basic emergency maternal obstetric and newborn care, integrated management of childhood illnesses, and kangaroo mother care
- Provide support for and linkages to family planning and reproductive health services
- Integrate HIV services within MNCH clinics
- Conduct provider-initiated HIV testing and counseling during immunization and routine well-child services

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- EGPAF works to strengthen broader MNCH outcomes such as improved provision and uptake of antenatal care, promote birth preparedness and delivery with a skill birth attendant, and strengthen postnatal care for mothers and newborns in over 8,000 sites where it currently support PMTCT services
- EGPAF works to improve MNCH services by increasing the capacity of health care workers to deliver PMTCT services, as well as, focused antenatal care, family planning, basic emergency maternal obstetric and newborn care, cervical cancer prevention, and nutrition services

Adult and Pediatric HIV Care & Treatment

SERVICES PROVIDED

- Provide comprehensive HIV care and treatment, including ARVs, to adults, children, and infants
- Link mothers and infants receiving PMTCT services to HIV care and treatment services
- Early identification and testing of HIV-exposed infants and young children using the best available screening methods
- Ensure appropriate linkages with other critical services
- Provision of psychosocial support for adults and children

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Enrolled over 2.4 million individuals, including nearly 189,000 children, into HIV care
- Started nearly 1.5 million individuals on antiretroviral treatment, including nearly 120,000 children

Health Systems Strengthening and Capacity Building

SERVICES PROVIDED

- Provide sub-grants and technical, financial, and operational capacity building support to districts to foster country engagement and ownership
- Strengthen human resource practices by assisting ministries of health to develop effective human resources management systems
- Improve leadership and governance by providing targeted technical assistance to ministries of health and building the capacity of local organizations
- Provide technical guidance and recommendations to ministries of health for national guidelines and policies, as well as, for the development of national training curriculums and materials
- Strengthen health management information systems to collect, review, analyze, and use data to ensure evidence-based decision making
- Strengthen the supply chain and reduce stock outs by mentoring pharmacy staff to improve forecasting, quantification, and timely ordering of drugs and other commodities

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Improve the quality of services delivered through training and supportive supervision
- Established and providing on-going support to three local affiliates in Côte d'Ivoire, Tanzania, and Mozambique
- Strengthened health service delivery through provision of performance-based financing initiatives throughout supported countries
- EGPAF/Zambia supported the Ministry of Health in the roll-out of the national electronic patient records system, SmartCare, in over 840 health facilities
